Leadership Message - Enhanced Provisions

As Director of Enhanced Provisions, I'm excited to share the extensive support we offer to students with Social, Emotional, and Mental Health needs from KS2 through to KS5. Our provisions are designed to provide tailored support for both academic and emotional development.

In KS3, students receive personalised support from a dedicated key worker, using our Core Strengths Curriculum, which focuses on building resilience and emotional regulation. Through transition classes, students are gradually reintegrated into mainstream lessons, ensuring they feel supported every step of the way.

For our KS4 students, we offer three distinct pathways to meet their individual needs. The Enhanced Provision pathway continues personalised support with a key worker, helping students thrive academically and emotionally. Our Nurture Pathway provides targeted support with Teaching Assistant's in classroom environments, ideal for students who benefit from a smaller, nurturing environment while still accessing mainstream education. Finally, the Engage 14-19 pathway focuses on equipping students with practical skills, ensuring they are prepared for the next stages of education or employment.

Led by Mrs Hullyer in KS3 and Miss Stoddart in KS4/5, our dedicated teams work closely with students and families to create individualised plans, ensuring each student can succeed and grow in their learning journey.

Cenett Shines in Support of Young Carers on Global's Make Some Noise Day

Year 9 student Cenett.Y, a dedicated young carer, recently took part in a national event supporting the work of local charity Kool Carers. Cenett, an active member of the Kool Carers club, enjoys taking part in fun activities such as camping, crafts, laser tag, and rock climbing. The charity provides essential support for young carers like Cenett, who balance caring for family members with their daily lives.

On Friday, October 11th, Cenett had the incredible opportunity to be interviewed by Radio X host Toby Tarrant as part of Global's Make Some Noise Day, an annual event that raises money for small charities making a big impact in their communities. During the interview, Cenett shared her experiences of being a young carer, including how it affects her daily life and mental health. Her family, listening from Australia and Turkey, tuned in to the live broadcast.

In addition to the interview, Cenett joined Toby for a special challenge, where he raised over £250,000 for charity by pedalling more than 50 miles along the Thames in a giant unicorn pedalo. Cenett pedalled alongside him for half a mile of the journey. After the challenge, she also beat Toby in a friendly game of pool!

Reflecting on the experience, Cenett said; "Meeting and being interviewed by Toby Tarrant on Radio X was amazing, and having the chance to help with the Thames Challenge was brilliant. It's important to me because it raises awareness for young carers and the Kool Carers charity."

BASILDON ACADEMIES WORD OF THE DAY

21 st - 25 th October 2024 Black History Month			
Monday:	Civil Rights Movement (noun) Definition: A movement in the 1950s and 1960s in the United States aimed at ending racial discrimination and ensuring equal rights for African Americans. Example: Black History Month commemorates key figures of the Civil Rights Movement, like Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who fought for justice and equality.		
Tuesday:	Segregation (noun) Definition: The enforced separation of different racial groups in a country, community, or establishment. Example: Black History Month reflects on the harmful effects of segregation and celebrates the heroes who fought to dismantle these unjust systems.		
Wednesday:	Pan-Africanism (noun) Definition: The belief that African peoples, both on the continent and in the diaspora, share a common history and destiny and should unite for political, economic, and social progress. Example: Pan-Africanism is a key topic during Black History Month, as it highlights the global unity of African descendants.		
Thursday:	Reparations (noun) Definition: The compensation provided to individuals or communities who have suffered harm, particularly in the context of the descendants of enslaved Africans seeking financial or social compensation for the injustices of slavery. Example: Discussions about reparations for African Americans often take centre stage during Black History Month, highlighting the lasting impact of slavesystemic racism.		
Friday:	Patrimony (noun) Definition: Patrimony refers to property or assets inherited from one's ancestors or heritage. It can also refer to cultural or historical heritage passed down through generations. Example: The museum's collection of ancient artifacts is a testament to the rich patrimony of the region, preserving the traditions and history of past generations.




