Through group activities and role-playing, they practice empathy, which not only enhances their social interactions but also fosters a supportive community within our school.

Self-awareness is something we nurture as well; We guide students to identify their strengths and areas for improvement, helping them reflect on their personal growth. This self-awareness allows them to set achievable goals and take ownership of their learning journey.






















BASILDON ACADEMIES WORD OF THE DAY

Friday:	Electorate (Noun) Definition: All the people entitled to vote in an election. Example: The electorate's engagement is crucial for a functioning democracy, a point emphasised during UK Parliament Week.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parent/carers may be asked for medical evidence to support absences after 3 days or reoccurring absence patterns.
- Wherever possible, parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours. If this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
