Students Inspired by Sarah Horne Visit

On Tuesday 12th March, professional illustrator and author Sarah Horne visited the Lower Academy to deliver creative storytelling workshops to students.

Sarah demonstrated how illustrations can bring stories to life, and encouraged students to use her techniques of creating characters through drawing. With Sarah's expert guidance, students drew characters and added key information to produce the protagonist, antagonist and a series of events to produce a story aimed at 7-9 year olds.


A number of careers were discussed, from astrophysicists to geologists. Additionally, students were exposed to many different role models that have broken stereotypes within science careers.

To report a student absence please visit the [Contact Us](#) page via the Basildon Lower Academy website and select the option for Attendance.

- Parents/carers must contact the school by 8.30am each day their child is absent.
- If no reason has been received for a child's absence, the Academy will initiate first day calling.
- Parents/carers must provide medical evidence to support all absences due to illness or medical appointments.
- Wherever possible parents/carers should make appointments outside of school hours but if this is unavoidable students should attend school before and after the appointment.
- If no appropriate medical evidence is provided then the Academies cannot authorise an absence. (ie. medical appointment card, prescription, doctor's letter.)



Job of the Week: Parking Attendant

What does a Parking Attendant do?

A parking attendant is an individual who ensures everyone using the car park does so according to the proper rules and regulations. Also known as parking warden and civil enforcement officer. These attendants patrol assigned car parks and streets to check for violations and issue penalty charge notices (PCNs) to any offenders. The work usually involves spending a considerable time outdoors in diverse weather conditions with large amounts of walking.
