Out of Hours Learning

Out of hours learning is set each week for our core subjects. Other subjects will set this fortnightly. The expectation is that all students complete their out of hours learning to the best of their ability each week. The homework that is set by each department is aligned with their current curriculum to enhance their confidence in their learning.

As a whole-school approach, we use a platform called Satchel. All the students' out of hours learning will be set on Satchel; however, they may be directed to another platform to support with this homework. For example, our Maths department use MathsWatch, Science use Kerboodle and English use GCSE Pod.

To log in to Satchel, students will need to visit <u>www.satchelone.com</u> and click the 'sign in with 365' button. If they are accessing from home, they will need to use their BA email address and the password they use to log in to school computers. If they still cannot log in or are unsure of their log in details, please direct them to see Mr Ogden.

Jack Petchey Achievement Award Event

Congratulations to Lower Academy students and staff who have recently been honoured by the Jack Petchey Foundation in recognition of their outstanding achievements.

Our award winners were invited to a special ceremony at the Towngate Theatre along with representatives from local schools. The prestigious awards were presented to our deserving winners by the Mayor of Basildon.

The scheme is a reward and recognition initiative which enables schools and youth organisations to celebrate the achievements of their young people as well as receive additional funding.
